Essential duties include but are not limited to the following:

- Provide 24-hour care of children in foster care to ensure their safety and well-being, and adjust the level of supervision according to the circumstances and their needs.
- Support their education by ensuring they attend classes. Participate in teacher conferences and provide assistance with homework as needed.
- Act as an educational advocate. Work with teachers and school administration to develop an effective educational plan.
- Implement daily activity schedules including, but not limited to, hygiene, mealtime, chores, schoolwork and recreation.
- Supervise and facilitate all recreational and leisure time.
- Work in cooperation with other PTFFC staff to provide a safe and nurturing home in compliance with applicable licensing and accreditation standards.
- Attend Treatment Team meetings and provide input to develop individual service and treatment plans on a regular basis.
- Notify appropriate Pathways staff of any changes in behavior, symptoms of serious illness, medical emergencies or behavioral crisis.
- Administer all prescribed medications and properly record medications given and observe for side effects.
- Implement emergency procedures when necessary and appropriately implement therapeutic interventions with children when necessary.
- Transport children to all appointments and extracurricular activities.
- Attend to healthcare needs, ensuring regular medical, psychiatric, dental, hearing, and vision exams are completed as necessary.

• Encourage and reinforce appropriate behaviors through the utilization of trauma informed care and Trust-Based relational Intervention principles.

What you will contribute:

- Your experience working with children diagnosed with behavioral and emotional disorders is preferred.
- Your willingness to care for children with complex behavioral health needs and/or children with complex medical needs with co-occurring complex behavioral health needs.

Due to the nature of our work, additional requirements include:

- Proof of valid Texas Driver's License (Type C), current auto insurance, access to reliable transportation, and good driving record.
- Minimum age of 21 years or older.
- High School Diploma or equivalent required.
- Discussion with/agreement by all family members to offer PTFFC services.
- Two personal and one familial reference.
- Cleared criminal background check.
- Cleared TB test results.
- Must attend orientation and 48 hours of pre-service training prior to licensure.
- Complete ongoing in-service training based on state requirements and COA standards.
- Must complete a home safety check and the Home Study process.
- Must provide copies of the following: social security card, birth certificates (all residing in the house), marriage certificates/divorce decree, biological children and adult immunization records, home insurance, vehicle insurance, and pet vaccinations.
- Obtain certification in CPR/First Aid
- Have a willingness to work collaboratively with biological families.
- Cooperate with visitation plans and play an active role in assisting the child to attain the goal of either reunification or a permanent placement.

What to expect:

- Professional foster parent pay.
- Access to respite service and crisis services.
- Work side-by-side with other knowledgeable, dedicated, and diverse individuals.
